# The Dillwyn Collection

The Journals of Lewis Weston Dillwyn (b.1778 d.1855)

Transcribed by Richard Morris

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Note: This is a working edition of the journals that have been transcribed over a number of years by Richard Morris. This edition includes inconsistencies in presentation and orthography – in part due to inconsistencies in the originals. This work is presented to aid research into the Dillwyn family and related topics. It is part of an ongoing project that aims in the future to bring together a number of diaries and to convert them to modern, marked-up formats that will allow more powerful features and searching.

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## **JANUARY**

It was ½ past 3 when Lewis & I reached Sketty from the New Years Ball at Swansea. After Breakfast I attended a Meeting of Vivians Friends to make arrangements for his Election & joined our Family party at Dinner at Penllergare			
Drove with John at 11 to a Petty Sessions at Llangafelach, & it was near 5 when we got back to Penllergare			
We all except Lewis returned from Penllergare to Sketty Hall			
I remained at home with Mary who tho' gradually convalescent has not yet recovered from her late severe illness, & our two Girls went to Swansea Church. Sir Jo Morris & his son, R Mansell & Mr Talbot dined with us & the latter slept here			
Leaving Talbot at Sketty Hall I started in my old Chariot about ½ past 10 & dined & slept at Coedriglan			
Left Coedriglan after Breakfast & drove with Nichol & Franklin to the Quarter Sessions at Cardiff. Dined with the Magistrates at the Angel & slept at the Cardiff Arms			
Spent the day as assistant Chairman in Court & we finished our Business at 4. 8 were transported & we had the heaviest Calendar & thinnest Bench I ever knew			
Left Cardiff about 9. Made several calls. Took up Nicholl at Cowbridge & brought him as far as Swansea on his way to Penrice. I dined at Vivians Election Dinner & reached home before 11			
Drove for a couple of hours to Swansea			
Mary & I drove for a couple of hours to Swansea			
Neither Mary nor I well & we remained in the House allday. The 3 youngsters went to St Mary's Church			
Drove for a couple of hours with Mary to Swansea			
Drove in the morning with Mary for an hour to Swansea. Mrs & Col Grant, Miss Morris, Henry Jones & Charles Jones dined here & they all			

went accompanied by Fanny, Lewis & myself to a Ball at Singleton in the Evening. Neither of the Mary's were sufficiently well to go there. Col & Mrs Grant returned about ½ past 3 to sleep here

Wednesday 14

Our Friends left us about noon. Lewis & I in the Phaeton at 2 set off for Pyle & dined at Margam with Talbot & Rous in our way. Reached Pyle soon after 9 & Grant the high Sheriff spent the Evening with us

Thursday 15

Drove soon after 9 to Bridgend & at ½ past 10 walked with Talbot in procession from the Wyndham Arms to the Hustings at the Town Hall, where we were unanimously elected Knights of the Shire. From a variety of causes I was disappointed of my proposer & Seconder & their [check spelling?] offices were performed for me by Fredericks & Bennett [?Burnett]. We dined at one. Rose from Table at ¼ past 4, & at ¼ before 10 we reached Sketty

Friday 16

In the afternoon drove with John in his open Carriage, & soon after leaving my Gate the horse ran restlessly off, kicking & etc, till he was stopped opposite to Vivians principal Lodge. We had a narrow escape. We then walked to Swansea & back & he[?] returned to Penllergare

Saturday 17

Walked with Lewis to Swansea, & Mary in the afternoon came to take me home again

Sunday 18

A fear of exposing my bald head to a cold Draught & a little earache prevented me from joining them, but my dear Mary & our 3 youngsters went to St Mary's Church. A sharp frost. In the afternoon I drove to dine & sleep at Penllergare where I met Mrs Morris of Sully & her daughters

Monday 19

Drove with John to the Carmarthenshire Election at Llanelly, where he & all his Friends gave plumpers for Sir Jo Williams, & from personal friendship gave my second vote for the Honl Mr Hever [?Trevor]. returned to dine & sleep at Penllergare

Tuesday 20

Left Penllergare about noon, & drove with John round by Swansea to Sketty where his Carriage met him to take him back to Penllergare. Lewis laid up by a sever cold

Wednesday 21

Walked to Swansea, & part of the way back when the Carriage met me. Dined with Mary & Fanny at Heathfield

Thursday 22

Walked with little Mary to Swansea, & halfway back when the Carriage met us

Friday 23

Drove with Mary in the afternoon for an hour to Swansea. I dined at Singleton to meet Col Morgan

Saturday 24 Lewis after being confined with a sore Throat was sufficiently recovered to go out, & we walked together to strike the Annual Balance at the Pottery. He walked back, & In returned with Mary in the Phaeton I went with the two Mary's to St Mary's Church. Lewis went to dine & Sunday 25 sleep at Penllergare Drove in the afternoon for a couple of hours to Swansea where I met Monday 26 John & Lewis. Mr & Mrs & Miss Benson, Mr & Mrs Usborn & their Friend Miss Seymour Capt & Mrs Jeffreys & Major Penrice dined with us Tuesday 27 Drove with Mary to Penllergare & returned to Dinner Wednesday 28 Mary & Fanny drove for a couple of hours to Penllergare. Mr M Moggridge came on a Visit for a couple of days. Miss Morris, Mr Alland [?Calland], Dr Howell & Mrs [?Mr] Thomas also dined with us Thursday 29 Drove with Moggridge to Swansea & he walked back with Lewis. r & Mrs Eden & Capt Mansell joined our Dinner party & the latter slept here Friday 30 Capt Mansell & Moggridge left us soon after Breakfast. Lewis went to shoot on Fairwood Moor, & bagged 19 Snipes, a wild Duck & etc. I drove to dine & sleep at Kilvrough Drove Sir C Cole from Kilvrough to Penrice Castle where I staid 3 or 4 Saturday 31 hours & returned home to Dinner. Lewis had gone to meet his Brother & spend a couple of days at the Gnoll

Sunday 1	The 3 Ladies went to Church at Swansea	
Monday 2	Drove in the afternoon for an hour to Swansea. Mr & Mrs John Traherne arrived on a Visit	
Tuesday 3	Mrs Traherne confined by a bad cold. Drove with Traherne to the Mumbles. Mrs Bassette & the two Miss Hewsons [?] & Capt G Mansell dined with us & the 3 former slept here	
Wednesday 4	Mrs Traherne confined all day to her Bed. Traherne & I in the afternoon drove for an hour to Swansea. Mr, Mrs & Miss Vivian & Stirling Benson dined with us	

Thursday 5 Mrs T better. Traherne & O walked to Singleton & afterwards drove to call at Woodlands. John & Emma with my darling Grand Chick came on a Visit Friday 6 John & I drove to Petty Sessions at Llangafelach, & returned to dinner at Sketty Weather very dirty. Mary confined all day by a severe cold, or Influenza Saturday 7 to her Room. Traherne & I drove for an hour in the afternoon to Swansea. Capt T Morgan, Revd Calvert Jones & R Pritchard dined with us Sunday 8 My dear Mary closely confined by a cold, & neither of the Trahernes well enough to attend Church, to which all the rest of our party went in the morning. John, Lewis & I walked back & called at Singleton Monday 9 Mr & Mrs Traherne left us to pay a Visit at penrice. I walked to Swansea & returned with Emma in their Carriage to Sketty Tuesday 10 Drove with John & attended a Public meeting at Swansea to consider of steps for procuring a Mail from London via Gloster, & also of what steps should be taken if Cardiff or rather Lord Bute should succeed in obtaining the Order in Council for holding the assizes alternately to be rescinded. The Evenings Post however satisfied us that this attempt has failed Wednesday 11 Drove with John to Swansea & swore him in as High Sheriff for the County. Miss Morris dined with us Thursday 12 Our dear John & Emma & their precious Pet left us & returned to Penllergare. I walked to attend as Horticultural Meeting at Swansea & Mary took me home in the Carriage Friday 13 Drove in the afternoon for half an hour to the Willows & again in the Evening to dine at John Groves Saturday 14 Weather very wet. Drove in the afternoon with Lewis to the Pottery Sunday 15 Lewis & Miss Mary went to Church & I read the Service to others of the Family at home Monday 16 My dear Mary's cold better & she took a drive in the close Carriage. Mr & Mrs R Franklen & their 3 Children arrived on a Visit. John, Messrs T E Thomas & Capt Lindsay also dined with us Tuesday 17 Walked with Franklen to Singleton & thence round by Woodlands home. J D Berrington, Mr Dorrian [?] & Stirling Benson dined with us

Wednesday 18 The Franklens left us about noon. John & Emma came over & John drove with me for an hour to Swansea after which they returned to Penllergare Thursday 19 Storms all day of wind & heavy Rain which prevented John & Emma from coming to us. Lewis dined at Arthur Jones' Friday 20 John & Emma with T arrived to spend a few days with us, & John & I afterwards drove for an hour to Swansea Saturday 21 Busy at home. Mary better & took a drive with John & Emma to Swansea Weather remarkably foul & wet. John, Emma, Molly & Lewis went to Sunday 22 Church & I read the Service at home Monday 23 Our dear John, Emma & T about one o'clock set off on their return to Penllergare. I afterwards drove with the two Marys' for a couple of hours to Swansea Tuesday 24 Drove over to the Willows, & returned to breakfast at Sketty. Engaged all day at planting Wednesday 25 Busy at planting. In the afternoon drove with Mary for an hour to Swansea to meet John on Shrieval arrangements. Col Morgan & Williams of Aberpergam [?] arrived on a Visit for the Assizes. Now for the first time to be held at Swansea Thursday 26 Drove to Swansea, & John as Sheriff arrived in State & joined us at the ordinary at the New Rooms where 70 sat down to Table. Though a heavy Rain 15 Carriages attended the Sheriff to meet the Judge at Morriston at 1/4 past 5, & after having attended the opening of the Court I returned with Col Morgan & W Williams to Sketty Attended the Grand Jury which was sworn in after Church & we Friday 27 afterwards dined with the Judge Sir Jo Williams Saturday 28 Wm Williams left us after Breakfast when Col Morgan & I drove to the Grand Jury, & after dining with them we reached home again about 10. the Jury in the afternoon was discharged

#### **MARCH**

Sunday 1 Mary & our 3 Youngsters went to Church. Col Morgan, John & I drove to dine at Singleton to meet Judge, Grand Jury & etc amounting altogether to 39 Drove to Swansea for an hour after Col Morgan had left us in the Monday 2 morning. Vivian, Sir Jo Morris, Socket & the following 4 gentlemen of the Bar dined with us, Wilson, Evans, Chilton & James Tuesday 3 Went with Mary & our two Girls to Swansea & I walked back. The fear of encuring[?] an ear ache which for several weeks has pained[?] me has prevented me from attending to the Trials in Court. John Traherne came to dine & sleep here Wednesday 4 Traherne & Lewis went early to attend a Trial respecting the Talbots manorial Rights in Gower which terminated in his favor. In the afternoon I drove Mary for an hour to Swansea Thursday 5 John came to bid me goodby & about 12 I left Sketty & posted on to sleep at Newport Friday 6 Embarked in the Cambria Packet about 8, & after a very stormy passage was landed at the Hotwells in 31/4 hours. Went to Millers Nursery, & after dining at Bristol reached the York House at ½ past 6. Took a Hot Bath Saturday 7 Left Bath in the York House Coach at 7, & at a little more than ½ past 6 I was reestablished in my old Quarters 45 Bridge Street. Dined at the Athenaeum Sunday 8 Made several calls. Attended Evening Service at St James's Church, & dined & spent the Evening at the Athenaeum Monday 9 Morning very wet & did not stir till I went & was sworn in at the House of Commons at 3. Voted for the Great Western Rail Road. Dined at Bellamy's & in the Evening attended a Ballot at the Athenaeum Tuesday 10 Much teased by a Face Ach. Dined at Bellamy's & voted against Ministers on Lord Chandos motion for a repeal of the Malt Tax in the Minority of 192 to 350. Got home at a little after one Wednesday 11 My Face so bad that I could .....[?] nothing more than a little sopped[?] lurk[?] for dinner. Went well wrapped up to the House at 5, & was obliged to come away soon after 9. Voted with Ministers in the majority against Ewarts Motion that no new matter should be brought forward after 11 at night Thursday 12 Face so swelled & bad that I remained all day in my appartment

Friday 13 Face so swelled & bad that I again remained all day in my appartment,

tho' I would have gone to the House if anything of importance had been

going on

Saturday 14 Much better. ventured in a Walk to the Athenaeum in the afternoon. Got

a Drink of Soup for my Dinner & returned soon after 5 to my

appartments [CHECK SPELLING]

SUNDAY 15 My face very much better & from being like a Moon at 3 days from full

it has nearly resumed its natural shape. Went in a Coach to the

Athenaeum & after an early Dinner returned to my apartments

Monday 16 Went to Grays Inn & the Title being declared to be good I paid for

Tygwyn - £525 odd. Went at 3 to the House & except that I drove with Pendarus  $\cite{Mathematical Pendarus}$  to attend a Ballot at the Athenaeum, I remained there till one

in the morning. Dined at Bellamy's

Tuesday 17 Tho' my face has recovered I was afraid as the weather was bad top go

out in the morning, but in the afternoon I called on H Gurney & etc. After dining early at the Athenaeum I went with Sir Chs Lemon to the House at

5 & remained there till 12

Wednesday 18 In the afternoon called on Genrl Grant & etc. Dined at Bellamy's & remained in

the House till after 12

Thursday 19 Hunted after Garden Seeds & etc. Dined at the Athenaeum. Went to the

House at 6 & remained there till it broke up at 1/4 before 11

Friday 20 I had engaged to dine at Alderman Thompsons & as I was setting out

John arrived on a Visit to me. I got back from Thompsons as soon as I could & then went with John to the House & voted against a resolution proposed by Ministers in the Minority 213 to 198. We got home about ½

past 12

Saturday 21 Weather unusually wet all day. John & I made some calls & went with

Talbot to see O'Neills pictures. John Traherne (who had arrived in the

morning with Sir C Cole) dined with us at the Athenaeum

Sunday 22 John & I went to the morning Service at Westminster Abbey. Afternoon

very wet. We dined with Talbot at Fentons Hotel

Monday 23 Went with Traherne & John & spent the day pleasantly at Loddiges'

Nursery at Hackney where we met Sir P Egerton. John & I dined at the Athenaeum, & went afterwards to the House of Commons where I

remained till 12

Tuesday 24

Went with Traherne & John to Knights Nursery in the Kings Road Chelsea. We afterwards all dined at the Athenaeum where I left John & went off to the H of Commons. Got home at ½ past 12

Wednesday 25 Went again with John to Knights Nursery, & afterwards went with Traherne to the Zoological gardens. We all dined at the Athenaeum & I took [?] them to the H of Commons where I remained till 12

Thursday 26

John & I went on Bermondsey business to Mr Framptons. Afterwards called on the Bishop of Landaff & etc. John & I dined with my old Friend Dr Frank where we met Lord Brecknock, Lord Neville & etc & from thence we went to the H of Commons where I voted in the minority for the Government amendment to Tooks Motion for advising the London University to confer Degrees

Friday 27

Went with Traherne & John to Lees' Nursery at Hammersmith & then to the Horticultural Gardens. They both dined with me at Bellamy's & attended the sitting of the House till ½ past 11 when they came with Vivian for some Tea to Bridge Street

Saturday 28

John & I in the morning went to a botanical Levee at Lamberts in Grosvenor Street, & in the Evening we dined at Charles Barclays

Sunday 29

John went with Traherne to the Royal Chapel at St James, & I not being vert well remained at home. We dined at Vivians

Monday 30

Went with John to the British Museum & etc. We dined together at the Athenaeum & soon after 8 he started homewards in the Mail. Lord Jo Russell's motion for an appropriation of the surplus Revenues of the Irish Church came in this Evening & I remained in the House till one when the debate was adjourned

Tuesday 31

Felt all forlorn[?] now John has left me. Dined with Traherne & Jos Sabine at the Athenaeum. remained in the House till after midnight & the debate again adjourned

#### **APRIL**

Wednesday 1

Went about to purchase the Seeds of Rock Plants & sent off 6 covers full to Mary. Dined at Bellamy's & remained in the House till after one when I went home. At the beginning of the sitting I voted against Ministers in the minority of 200 to 216, on a motion for rescinding a former resolution with regard to the Leicester[?] Election Petition

Thursday 2

Walked in the City on Business. Dined at Bellamy's. Afterwards attended a siting of the Royal Society, & returned to the House. Came away &

Russells motion Friday 3 Attended the House from 4 o'clock in Committee on Lord John Russell's motion which at ½ past 3 this evening was carried against by [sic] Ministers by 322 to 289 Saturday 4 went in the morning to Lambert's & etc. Dined with Mr & Mrs Bevan at Dr Sim's & afterwards spent an hour with Talbot who is still laid up by a sprain at Fentons Hotel Sunday 5 Weather very wet & I did not move out till I attended afternoon Service at the Abbey. Dined at the Athenaeum & afterwards spent an hour or two with Talbot at Fentons Monday 6 Went to the City, & afterwards called on Lord Cawdor & etc. Attended the House from 4 till ½ past 12, & again declined to vote on the Irish **Church Question** Tuesday 7 Attended the Committee on the Neath Market Bill which cut my day in two. Went to the House at 4 & remained there till 7 when I walked to dine at the Athenaeum. Returned to the House & remained there till one when I went to Bed & again declined to vote on the Irish Church Question. On the whole my inclinations most led me to support the Ministers, but I more or less disapproved of the proceeding on both sides & disliked to vote in opposition to my Colleagues Wednesday 8 Spent the morning at Knight's Nursery. At 5 heard of the resignation of Ministers announced to the House by Sir Robt Peel & an adjournment till Monday immediately followed. Dined at Sir Chs Lemons & met Lady George & Miss E Murray[?] & etc Thursday 9 Executed various Errands preparatory to leaving Town. Went to the House which met only for an Election Ballot & then adjourned. Dined at the Athenaeum Friday 10 Started from Hatchetts at about 20 minutes past 6 & in 12 hours reached Gloster in the Regulation Coach. Posted on to sleep at Newnham Saturday 11 Posted on to Chepstow where I met the Mail, & so reached Swansea at ½ past 7. My Carriage was waiting with Lewis for my arrival, & I at once drove & found all well at home Sunday 12 Caught a baddish cold on the Journey & did not stir out. The 3 youngsters went to Church Drove for an hour to Swansea in the afternoon Monday 13

went to Bed at 12 or soon after as I determined not to vote at all in Lord

Tuesday 14 A cold caught on the Journey troublesome & I did not leave Sketty all day Wednesday 15 John drove over to spend the morning with us & he went with me for half an hour to Swansea & afterwards returned to Penrice Thursday 16 Drove in the morning with Lewis to the Pottery & etc & Mary came to take me home to Dinner Friday 17 Good Friday. We all went to St Marys Church & I walked back to Sketty Saturday 18 Drove in the afternoon with Mary for an hour to Swansea A slight cold kept me at home all day. The two Mary's & Lewis went to Sunday 19 Church Monday 20 Drove in the morning with Mary & afterwards with John to Swansea. John, Emma & my precious Grand Chick arrived on a Visit Tuesday 21 Drove with John in the Phaeton to Neath & from thence to attend a County Meeting which he as Sheriff had called at Pyle. It was a struggle in the no Popery cry between the Tories & the Liberals & the latter by the aid of a Legion of their Tenants & of Parsons beat us almost 2 to 1. Not one Gent on the Liberal side took any returns with him. we lunched at Margam & reached Sketty about ½ past 7 Wednesday 22 I did not leave home all day. John & Emma drove to Penllergare & returned to dinner. Lewis in the Evening went to a Ball at Col Camerons, & slept at the Mackworth Arms Thursday 24 Spent the day chiefly at home about new rock work. John & I dined at Mr Edens where we met Vivian & a large party Friday 24 Drove for a couple of hours to Swansea. John, Emma & Miss Mary went to spend the day at Penrice & returned to us in the Evening Saturday 25 Busy about my rock work day [sic]. Arthur Jones junr, Charles Jones, & Rodney Eden dined with us Sunday 26 We all went on two Carriages to St Marys Church Monday 27 Busy all day about my rock work. John & Emma & my precious Pet in the afternoon returned to Penllergare Tuesday 28 Busy all day about my rock work at home. The two Mary's too a drive & ....[?] at Danygraig

Wednesday 29 Busy about my rock work all day. John & Emma came over early to assist me & spent the day

Thursday 30 Except that I went with the two Mary's for a couple of hours to Swansea I was engaged from 6 to 6 about the new Rockwork

## **MAY**

Friday 1	Busy all day at my rock work		
Saturday 2	Not well, & went out only to my rockwork		
Sunday 3	Unwell. The two Mary's & Lewis went to Church & in the Evening Mary & Fan went to Penllergare leaving us to follow them tomorrow		
Monday 4	My little Grandaughter was born on the 3rd but it being Sunday was kept today. John drove over to breakfast & took little Mary back with him to Penllergare where I joined the party in the afternoon		
Tuesday 5	We all spent the whole day right happily at Penllergare		
Wednesday 6	I drove back to Sketty with Miss Mary soon after breakfast, & Mrs D & Fan about noon followed us. Lewis remained at Penllergare		
Thursday 7	Drove for a couple of hours with Mary to Swansea & attended a Meeting to consider the propriety of saddling the owners instead of the occupiers of small Houses with the payment of Piers[?] Rates. Sir Jo Morris & his son George, Revd T Morris, Miss Morris & R A Mansell dined with us		
Friday 8	Drove to a Petty Session at Langafelach & then with John to Penllergare where I spent about an hour & returned home by 5		
Saturday 9	My dear Fan has this day compleated her 27th year. I drove with Lewis to the Pottery for an hour in the morning & got home by 12. John & Emma spent the afternoon & dined with us		
Sunday 10	Mr Thos Thomas had appointed to come to me on some urgent Business of Johns respecting the Lanelly railway, & being much harried[?] by preparations for starting for Town tomorrow I was prevented from leaving home. The 3 youngsters went to Church		
Monday 11	Breakfasted at 5 at Sketty & at 6 embarked in the Steamer for the Hotwells where I arrived at 4. Went with Mr Howell Gwyn[?] to Millers Nursery. Dined at 7 at the Bank[?] & went on to sleep at the York House at Bath		

Tuesday 12

In a Day Coach I reached my old Quarters in Bridge Street about 8. Found the House had adjourned, & as a heavy Rain setd [?settled] I spent the Evening at my Apartments

Wednesday 13 Engaged most of the morning with Dr Sims & otherwise about our dear Fans Health & in the afternoon about opposing on Johns behalf the Llanelly rail road Bill. Dined at Bellamys & in the Evening supported the new highway Bill in Committee & voted in one Division for it. Got home before 10

Thursday 14

Weather very wet & went but little out. Stood[?] my Shot[?] for the Carlow & Canterbury Election Petitions & escaped. Went to dine at the Athenaeum & returned to the House where I remained till about 11

Friday 15

Mr & Mrs Janson called on me, & afterwards attended our Agricultural Association. Went to the House at four. Dined at Bellamy's. Voted for the Glasgow Water Works, & in a Committee[?] of supply[?] against Hume's motion for reducing the Yeomanry. Got home as the clock struck 12

Saturday 16

Engaged all the morning with Crawder [?Cawdor or Crawshay] about the Llanelly Bill, & other Business. Dined at Charles Barnebys [?Barclays] & not being very well returned home by 10

Sunday 17

Took medicine & did not go out in the morning. Went in the afternoon to St James' Church but it was so hot & crowded that as I could not get a Seat I came away. Dined at the Athenaeum & spent the Evening pleasantly there with several of my Friends

Monday 18

Again engaged in the morning with Crowder, & he came & interrupted a Chat with Dawson Turner who was breakfasting with me. Walked afterwards to visit my old acquaintance Anderson at the Botanical Garden at Chelsea & returned to present 2 petitions at 4 for John & Howel Gwyn against the Lanelly Bill. Dined at Bellamy's & remained till the House broke up at 10 o'clock

Tuesday 19

My dear Lewis, God bless him is this day of age & I much regret my absence from our happy domestic circle. In the morning I went to the City about Business of his & at ½ past 3 escaped from 2 Ballots for Election Committees. I dined at the Athenaeum with Charles & Arthur Barclay & D Turner, & then returned to the House where I remained till midnight

Wednesday 20 Variously engaged all the morning. Dined at Bellamy's & remained at the House till 12

Thursday 21

Variously engaged in the morning. Attended for two Election Ballots & through a Blunder the House abruptly adjourned till tomorrow an Acct of the E....[?] Ballot being incomplete. Dined & spent the Evening at the Athenaeum with some[?] of my Friends

Friday 22

Engaged in the morning about the Lanelly Railway & Neath Market Bills till one when I went to the Committee on the Dee erry[?] Road Bill, & remained there till I went to the House at 4.
