Top 5 cultural things to know in Swansea!

Moving to another country can be daunting and nerve-wracking, to help settle you in, we've got some tips to help you settle in!

- Sundays In the UK, shops are closed earlier than usual, normally this is by 4pm, so bear this in mind when out and about!
- Buses When getting off the bus, don't forget to thank the driver!
- Queuing this is something that we do well here in the UK! If you try jump the queue, you will get some side eye so be careful and be patient! Even if you are in a hurry you should not cut in front of others as this is seen as rude.
- Greeting not only do we say hello, we also say OK? Alright? It's just another form of greeting rather than asking how you are!
- Apologising Bumped into someone? Say sorry before walking away. Need to get someone's attention? Start your sentence with sorry. Need to squeeze past someone in a crowded room? You guessed it – say sorry as you move past.
